- The Court finds that the District is in compliance З. with the Judgment and all Orders issued by the Court pursuant to the Judgment.
- The District's obligation to provide Augmented Service is effective in perpetuity.
- The Court defers to the future further consideration 5. and decision on the issue of the District's obligation to provide the Overlying Owners with Augmented Service exceeding a cumulative total of 500 acre feet per year. Should any party seek Court 10 | intervention on this issue, it may do so consistent with this Order, paragraph 38 of the Judgment, and the Court's reserved jurisdiction in this matter.
 - In future years, the District's Annual Report is to 6. be prepared in a summary format, to provide the substance of the information required by paragraph 19(b) of the Judgment (p.110). That summary Annual Report will be served on each of the parties, but not filed with the Court. There will no longer be a mandatory hearing on the Annual Report nor Court review and approval of the Annual Report.
 - If a party has an objection to the Annual Report, that party shall make a good faith effort to meet and confer regarding the objection with the District, and attempt to resolve the objection. If the objection cannot be resolved between the parties, and the objecting party intends to request a hearing to address the objection, the Court's continuing jurisdiction and the procedures stated in paragraphs # and \$ of this Order shall be implemented.
